MODERN SLAVERY ACT STATEMENT

Structure and supply chains

ET Holdings is a UK + European road haulage operator with depots throughout the UK, as such it provides transport, warehousing and vehicle maintenance services to its customers.

Most services supplied to ET Holdings are from the Haulage sector.
